REMOVAL or ABANDONMENT OF AN UNDERGROUND STORAGE TANK

Prior to the removal of a residential <u>or</u> commercial underground storage tank (to include all tanks storing flammable and combustible liquids <u>other than propane</u>), Applications need to be submitted to and approved by <u>both</u> the Fire Marshal and Building Official.

See each application for specific contractor requirements.

<u>Note:</u> Essex does not have a town ordinance for removal of an underground storage tank if a property is being sold; however, a new owner may not be able to get a mortgage if a house is purchased with an underground storage tank. An underground storage tank when abandoned; would require draining of all liquids in the tank, digging to bottom and cutting a hole in the bottom of tank to get a soil sample from under the tank, then filling the tank with sand. This procedure is typically more expensive than removing the tank.

Fire Marshal Procedure:

- 1. Applicant completes Application to Abandon/Remove an Underground Storage Tank
- 2. Application fee is \$40 per tank.

The Fire Marshal must be present upon abandonment or removal to inspect the ground to make sure there is no contamination. The Fire Marshal completes a report stating the condition of the tank and soil which then becomes part of the property file.

Building Official Procedure:

- 1. Applicant completes a Building Permit Application. State in the description field that it is for an UST Abandonment/Removal.
- 2. The fee is \$30 based on a TCV of \$1,000 regardless of the number of tanks being addressed. If the applicant chooses to combine the abandonment/removal with the install of a new tank, the actual TCV is used and the fee is calculated accordingly.
- 3. Once the Building Official receives the Fire Marshal's report indicating the tank has been removed, the final inspection can be scheduled and the building permit closed.
