Motion was made by Bruce Glowac to approve and recommend to the Board of Finance an appropriation from the unassigned fund balance in an amount not to exceed \$126,500 for exterior window replacement at the Town Hall. The Town of Essex, CT., (the "Issuer") hereby expresses its official intent pursuant to §1.150-2 of the Federal Income Tax Regulations, Title 26 (the "Regulations"), to reimburse expenditures paid sixty days prior to the date of passage of the Resolution, and thereafter, in the maximum amount and for the capital project defined above with the proceeds of bonds, notes, or other obligations ("Bonds") authorized to be issued not later than 18 months after the later of the date of the expenditure or the substantial completion of the project, or such later date the Regulations may authorize. The Issuer hereby certifies that the intention to reimburse as expressed herein is based upon its reasonable expectations as of this date. The Treasurer or its designee is authorized to pay project expenses in accordance herewith pending the issuance of reimbursement bonds, and to amend the resolution. Stacia Libby seconded the motion. All in favor.

RFP for School Roof Design and Engineering Costs Request

There was discussion on funding that is needed in order to obtain schematics for the Town Hall Roof and the Elementary School Roof. It is estimated the schematics for the Town Hall Roof would be around \$5,000 and the Elementary School Roof \$20,000. The Selectmen decided to table this discussion until the next Selectmen meeting.

Set Public Hearing

Motion was made by Bruce Glowac to set a Public Hearing Meeting for Wednesday, November 19, 2014 at 7:00 pm to hear any or all persons who wish to be heard in regard to the proposed capital program appropriation and bond authorization. Norman Needleman seconded the motion. All in favor.

SELECTMEN GENERAL DISCUSSION:

Mr. Needleman reported that the Household Hazardous Waste Facility is on Town Property. When it was initially set up, in the permit requirement, there is an obligation to provide security there, which was done with cameras. There were issues with those cameras, where they were not working. The River COG is responsible for the security system. Mr. Needleman reported that he did not want the Town to be responsible for this system. The Town of Essex is not comfortable for taking on this responsibility or the liability.

John Heiser reported to the Selectmen that for the Referendum new voting cards that have the capability of doing 5 questions would need to be purchased. Mr. Heiser also reported that the Registrars would need time to test the ballots and to test the memory card to make sure everything works. He did state the printing of the ballots is quick.

There was discussion on the possibility of holding the Referendum from noon to 8 pm instead of 6 am to 8 pm.

John Heiser reported that the Town has a terrific Pollworking crew.

There was discussion on the 75 feet ruling and where it is actually measured from.

Motion was made by Norman Needleman to adjourn the meeting at 6:26 p.m. Bruce Glowac seconded the motion, it was unanimously approved. Motion carried.
