#### BOARD OF SELECTMEN REGULAR MEETING April 6, 2022

#### Informational Items, Communications and Correspondence

#### Connecticut Water Company - Project scheduled to start week of April 10th

Connecticut Water will be replacing approximately 1.2 miles of 60-year-old water main on Main Street (State Route 602) in Centerbrook/Ivoryton. The work will occur from Deep River Road (State Route 154) through Ivory Street. The initial section of the project **between Cumberland Farms and Essex Elementary School** will require night work to minimize traffic congestion and help ensure public and worker safety. **This work is scheduled from April 10th through April 14th between 7 p.m. and 7 a.m.** Starting the week of April 18th, work hours will be 7 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. Work hours may be slightly adjusted for the remainder of the project based on coordination between the CT DOT and the Town of Essex. Project completion is expected in August 2022. **Driveway access in the construction area, including all access drives to Essex Elementary School will** increase the flow of water available to fire hydrants. Any planned necessary service interruptions and other information related to the night work will be communicated directly to impacted customers at least 48 hours prior to the interruption. # **Fair Housing Policy Statement**

It is the policy of the TOWN OF ESSEX to promote fair housing opportunities and to encourage racial and economic integration in all its programs and housing development activities.

Programs funded and administered by the TOWN OF ESSEX must comply with the provisions of Section 46a-64c of the C.G.S., and with related state and federal laws and regulations that prohibit discriminatory housing practices.

The TOWN OF ESSEX or any of sub-recipient of the TOWN OF ESSEX will carry out an affirmative marketing program to attract prospective buyers or tenants of all majority or minority groups, without consideration of race, color, religion, sex, national origin, ancestry, creed, sexual orientation, gender identity or expression, marital status, lawful source of income, disability, age or because the individual has children in all programs and housing development activities funded or administered by the TOWN OF ESSEX.

The municipality's Fair Housing Officer, NORMAN M. NEEDLEMAN, is responsible for the enforcement and implementation of this policy. The Fair Housing Officer may be reached at 860-767-4340 or <u>nneedleman@essexct.gov</u>.

Complaints pertaining to discrimination in any program funded or administered by the TOWN OF ESSEX, may be filed with the Fair Housing Officer. The municipality's Grievance Procedure will be utilized in these cases.

Complaints may also be filed with the Commission on Human Rights and Opportunities, Special Enforcement Unit, 21 Grand Street, Hartford, CT 06106, Telephone (860) 541-3403 within 180 days of the alleged violation by submitting a notarized complaint and/or the Boston Regional Office of FHEO, U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Thomas P. O'Neill, Jr. Federal Building, 10 Causeway Street, Room 321, Boston, MA 02222-1092, Telephone (617) 994-8300 or 1-800-827-5005, TTY (617) 565-5453. A complaint may be filed with HUD within one year after an alleged violation. Additionally, an individual may file suit, at his/her expense, in Federal District Court or State Court within two years of an alleged violation. If the individual cannot afford an attorney, the Court may appoint one. A suit can be brought even after filing a complaint, if the complaining party has not signed a conciliation agreement and an Administrative Law Judge has not started a hearing. A court may award actual and punitive damages and attorney's fees and costs.

A copy of this policy statement will be given annually to all TOWN OF ESSEX employees and they are expected to fully comply with it. In addition, a copy will be posted throughout the TOWN OF ESSEX.
